

## **JAPANESE GOVERNMENT SCHOLARSHIP FOR 1999 (RESEARCH STUDENT)** *DN 20/4/98*

Applicants who wish to study at a Japanese university as research students are invited to apply for the above mentioned Scholarship program for the academic year 1999.

### **1. FIELD OF STUDY**

**Humanities and Social Sciences:** Literature, History, Aesthetics, Law, Politics, Economics, Commerce, Pedagogy, Psychology, Sociology, Music, Fine Arts, etc.

**Natural Sciences:** Pure Science, Engineering, Agriculture, Fisheries, Pharmacology, Medicine, Dentistry, Home Economics, etc.

### **2. QUALIFICATIONS**

1. Nationality: Kenyan
2. Age: Under 35 years of age as of April 1, 1999 (i.e. born on and after April 2, 1964)
3. Academic Background: First Class or Upper Second Class Honours

### **3. TERMS OF SCHOLARSHIP**

Applicants may choose one of the following two categories:

1. Two years from April 1999 to March 2001 for those who wish to study as non-degree students, i.e. research students (Kenkyu-sei) or auditors (Choko-sei). (The term shall normally include 6 months for the study of the Japanese language to be given to those whose knowledge of the language is insufficient to pursue their studies.)
2. One year and a half from October 1999 to March 2001 for those who wish to study as non-degree students, i.e. research students (Kenkyu-sei) or auditors (Choko-sei). (The term shall normally include 6 months for the study of the Japanese language to be given to those whose knowledge of the language is insufficient to pursue their studies.)

Those who wish to enter Master's or Doctoral program of a graduate school must sit for and pass the entrance examination given by the university concerned after having studied at least for 6 months as non-degree research students. Failure in the examination will result in re-enrollment as non-degree research students.

### **4. ALL APPLICANTS INTERESTED SHOULD SUBMIT**

- a) Copy of Academic record of university attended
- b) Copy of the university diploma, or of certificate of degree
- c) Curriculum Vitae
- d) Copy of Birth Certificate
- e) Field of study and study program in Japan

The above documents are to be sent to the undermentioned person and should reach him not later than **31st May, 1998**.

After conducting the preliminary screening, only those applicants who are successful will be provided with the application forms for the scholarship by the Japan Information and Culture Centre, Embassy of Japan. The selected applicants will then be invited to sit for an examination and interview, which will be held towards the end of August or early September 1998.
