

Capacity Building



Over the last one year, the Directorate of e-Government has given technical training to over 200 ICT officers working at various ministries in Nairobi.

It has also conducted a countrywide awareness campaign and sensitization countrywide. Most heads of departments and Districts Officers have been trained on how to access and use their email addresses on the .ke domain.

Web Presence



All government ministries have websites. Currently they are being upgraded to accommodate to a standard template and to allow the next phase of web presence- online transactions. So far, it is possible to:

- Check voting status online
- Download police P3 forms online
- Log customs documents online



Employment Online

On 16th March 2007, the Public Service Commission of Kenya launched an integrated online recruitment and selection system. Of the 5,000 applicants who submitted their applications for the vacancy advertised shortly after the launch, 2,000 of them did so online.

Integrated Population Registration System



A Kenyan who recently tried to get a new passport was pleasantly surprised. She says the Immigration Department at Nyayo House has
undergone remarkable changes. Previously,
it was a den of brokers who could promise to
speed up the process for you at a fee.
They often vanished into thin air with the
money, but the stories of woes have ended.
These days you can follow the process with
the click of a mouse and new applicants can
get their passports in less than 14 days. Times
have really changed in this house that once
housed a torture chamber.



The National ID system has been upgraded to produce 25,000 IDs per day from previous daily maximum of 5,000. A new passport issuing system has been acquired.


